# Year 6 Homework

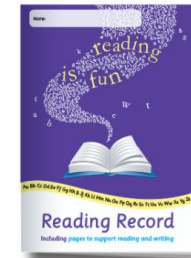
## Reading

This year reading will be completed as a group. Your child has been grouped with pupils of similar reading ability and they will read together each day.

All the children have the same book and will read together each day. Every evening children will be set a reading task. This may be to read 2 chapters or read 1 chapter and complete a comprehension task in their purple reading journals.

This will create reading communities in the class room and encourage children to discuss their reading. We will contact you if your child begins to fall behind with their reading tasks.

Children have a reading diary where they will record daily reading and homework.



Children also have a purple reading journal to complete reading comprehension tasks.

## Spelling

Children must know all of the year 5 and 6 spelling list by the end of year 6. We will support this weekly by giving short tasks to practice these words each week but children can practice these words at any time.

Children also will take part in weekly spelling lessons to practice spelling rules and patterns. Children will have a task each week to practice these spelling patterns also.
