- What does this reading domain mean?
- What skills are we learning?
- 2b- Retrieve and record information/identify key details from fiction and non-fiction

- Retrieval is when we find **key pieces of information** within the text you are reading
- We do this by looking for the text for a specific answer by **skimming** and **scanning** for key words.
- We then read around keys words to help us retrieve the answer.

- Retrieval questions usually make up around 30-42% of SATS questions at the end of y6.
- They are a vital reading skill to help children reach the expected standard at the end of primary school.
